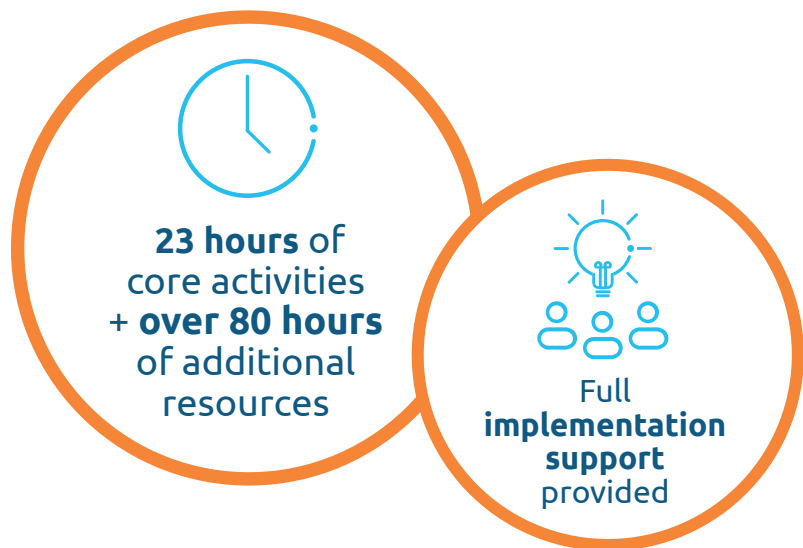


## The first programme of its kind, designed to support postgraduate students in the effective use of English in their academic studies.

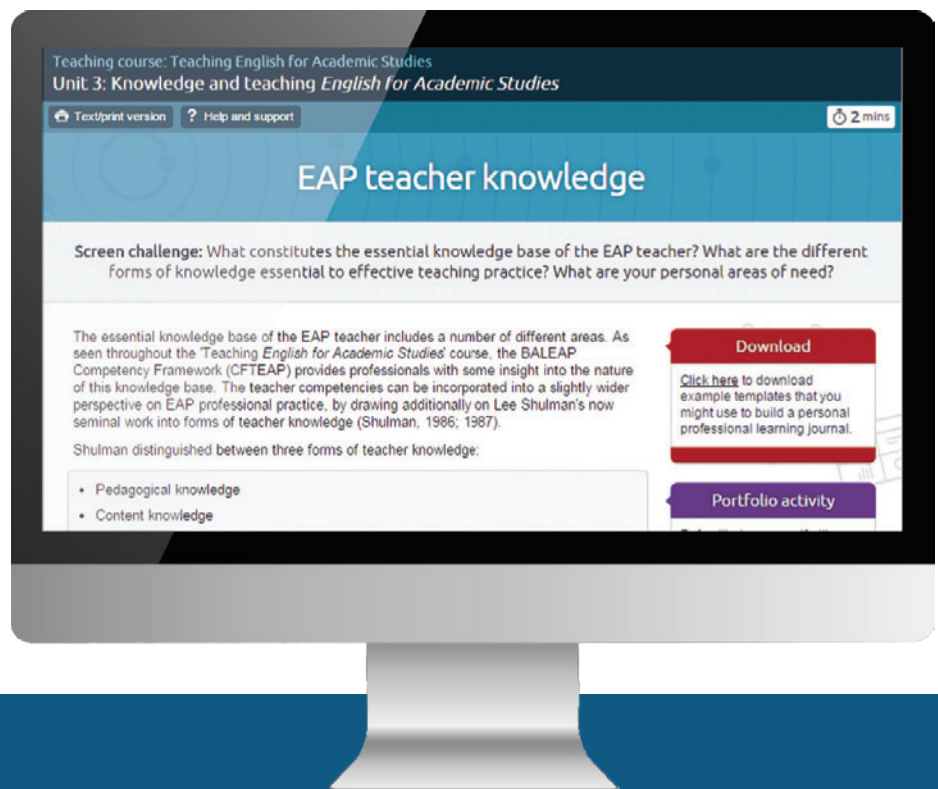
